Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects

Carers Sitting Service – volunteers give the carer a break by sitting with the person being cared for **My Neighbourhood** – befriending and activities to reduce loneliness and social isolation

Carers Support Group – we organise a monthly meeting to offer carers the opportunity to share concerns, receive support and simply take time out to relax

Musical Monday's – is a monthly event to replace songs and scones, for older people to come together to participate in a performance by local musicians, followed by conversation, tea and cake. It is run in partnership with the Community One Stop

In My Day— to build on the work done with the Plough to Plate workshops, Ryedale Carers Support has continued to deliver an exciting programme of reminiscence-based workshops exploring the stories of people and places in Ryedale through the ages. The programme of 6 sessions explores a range of themes linked to the story of food, farming, music and leisure activities. Sessions provide the opportunity for participants to explore the remarkable collection of artifacts provided by heritage engagement consultant, Virginia Arrowsmith, who led the sessions.

Walking Group – the group meets monthly and every client has a dedicated volunteer walking with them. The carer (husband/wife/son/daughter) has a day off knowing their loved one is doing something they love. The benefits of physical exercise and good company are incalculable

Community Development in Northern Ryedale and Whitby District – our Activities Coordinator runs a Farmers Breakfast in Lythe and has supported the development of a number of friendship groups in small rural communities in northern Ryedale and rural parts of Whitby District.

On - Line Activities the silver lining of lockdown has been the development of 2 online activities that have filled an unmet need and have proved to be very popular

Virtual Walks Volunteer Rangers Jim Hall & Davy Major from North York Moors National Parks lead monthly virtual walks, enabling people to enjoy the countryside and a chat from the comfort of their sofas through Zoom. Walks include views, local and historical information and show the best of the national park in all seasons. Time for a chat, questions and sharing is always a part of these two friendly and informal groups. If people are interested and need help starting with Zoom, we can offer support to get them going.

Virtual Singalongs over 25 people who can't get out meet on line to sing along to a variety of musical genres, music from the shows, country, sounds of the 60's and much more. The social connection has helped people feel less isolated:

Community One Stop run in conjunction with Ryedale Charities Together the Community One Stop is a doorway into the voluntary sector. Most people know how to access their GP and Health and Adult Services but the voluntary sector can be very confusing. There are now 4 Community One Stops, they are held once a month in the 4 market towns: Pickering, Malton, Kirkbymoorside and Helmsley.

RCS 2023 Calendar

It was so successful last year, Ryedale Carers Support decided to do another calendar for 2023 as a way to reach out and connect with all our clients and volunteers. Each month features photographs linked to a different RCS activity with comments to encourage conversation. We have received many compliments from delighted clients and volunteers.

Volunteer Newsletter

A quarterly newsletter for Ryedale Carers Support volunteers to keep them informed and involved in what we have been doing. As well as a 'letter from Claire', we feature recent sessions and events; what's coming up; a humorous cartoon and useful contacts which the volunteer can share with the person they are visiting

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the objectives and activities and in the planning of future activities.

Achievements and performance

A detailed review of the charity's activities and achievements in year are contained in the separate document 'Ryedale Carers Support Annual Report April 2022 - March 2023'

Financial Review

The results for the period ending 31st March 2023 show final balances of £57,971 unrestricted general funds; £52,553 designated funds and £65,159 restricted funds. In year, the overall operational deficit, after transfers was £15,700; comprising a surplus in year of £8,046 on unrestricted funds offset by a transfer of £7,500 from designated funds and a deficit of £16,246 on restricted funds.

Whilst the general unrestricted funds include spend this year on the telephone upgrade of £4,637, this had been set aside in designated funds last year to a value of £7,500, hence this provision has been transferred back to general funds now that it has been completed. The deficit in year on restricted funds reflects several grants still catching up on spend due to the suspension of some activities during the pandemic. The restricted funding grants are listed in note 13 to the accounts, 'Movement of Funds', all of which show favourable balances at 31 March 2023.

The level of free reserves, that is those unrestricted funds not tied up in tangible fixed assets, nor held in designated funds, stands at £57,386 at 31st March 2023. The trustees consider that this level of free reserves is in line with the target level set in the reserves policy of one quarter of the annual projected expenditure for the forthcoming year.

Plans for the future

The arrangement of blended work will continue, our online activities have been a great success and I am sure will go from strength to strength. Our funding is once again more secure having successfully secured the sitting service contract with North Yorkshire County Council. This service will be renamed the Carers Break Service. The funding that enabled us to support people living on their own is called 'My Neighbourhood', we are still delivering this with Carers Plus Yorkshire but it will now be called "Our Neighbourhood'. Here, there is less money which has meant having to concentrate on the volunteer befriending and working with other organisations to deliver activities. However, since we have stopped 'Songs and Scones' and latterly 'Musical Mondays' we have realised how valued these activities are and how important it is to provide transport. It is the aim of RCS to deliver 2 flagship activities: Farmers Breakfast in Lythe and a quarterly musical event in Ryedale.

We know that working with others enables RCS to provide the best possible service for their clients.

Trustee's responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice). The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, of the charity for that period.

In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the applicable Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures that must be disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are also responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the charity and financial information included on the charity's website in accordance with legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements.

1 Basis of preparation

1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention. These accounts have been prepared in accordance with: the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

1.2 Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

2 Accounting policies

2.1 Income

Recognition of income

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses, unless required or permitted by the FRS 102 SORP or FRS 102.

Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the charity has evidence of entitlement to the resources and receipt is probable.

Government grants

The charity has received government grants in the reporting period.

Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Gift Aid receivable is included in income when there is a valid declaration from the donor. Any Gift Aid amount recovered on a donation is considered to be part of that gift and is treated as an addition to the same fund as the initial donation.

Contractual income and performance related grants

In the case of contractual income and performance related grants, income is only recognised once the charity has provided the specified services or performance related conditions.

Volunteer help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the Trustees' Annual Report.

Investment income

This is included in the accounts when receipt is probable and the amount receivable can be measured reliably.

2.2 Expenditure and Liabilities

Raising funds

Cost of raising funds comprise those costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Charitable activities

Charitable activities expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Where costs are apportioned between projects, it is on the basis of staff time spent on each activity.

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Redundancy cost

The cost of redundancies are calculated using the statutory redundancy pay guidelines.

2.3 Assets

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year and cost at least £700 each. They are valued at cost. Depreciation is provided at rates to write off the cost of the asset over a four year period leaving a nil residual value.

Taxation

The company is a registered charity and is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds that are resources set aside for specific purposes at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds are funds which can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

13.2 Details of Funds Held

Unrestricted Funds (General)

The General fund is unrestricted and available for the general purposes of Ryedale Carers Support.

Designated Funds

Reflects the redundancy and wind down provision of £52,553. The previous year provision of £7,500 to upgrade the telephone system has been completed in year within general funds.

Restricted Funds

The current restricted funds are only available for the purposes specified for each fund, which are:

NYCC Carers Sitting Service Ryedale - supported by NYCC Health & Adult Services and the local Clinical Commissioning Groups to provide a sitting service, using volunteers to give carers a break.

<u>Support for Carers Scarborough & Caring Together Whitby</u> - in partnership with Ryedale Carers Support delivering a range of services across Scarborough, Whitby and Ryedale.

My Neighbourhood - in partnership with Carers Plus Yorkshire, is about connecting communities and providing support to people who may be isolated, lonely or need a bit of extra help. Funded by NYCC. £5k of the balance remaining 31 March 2023 reflects a grant from Transforming Community Mental Health Services via Next Steps to provide a 1:1 Befriending service in 2023/24.

<u>Carers Support Group</u> - one monthly support group to offer carers the opportunity to share concerns, receive support and take a break from their caring role.

<u>Volunteer Expenses</u> - supported by The Robert McAlpine Foundation to enable Ryedale Carers Support to recruit more volunteers and pay their out of pocket expenses.

<u>Plough to Plate</u> - From September 2021 to replace Farmers Breakfast, Ryedale Carers Support has been working in partnership with North Yorkshire County Record Office (NYCRO), to deliver an exciting programme of reminiscence-based workshops exploring the stories of people and places in Ryedale through the ages.

<u>Lythe Farmer's Breakfast</u> - a monthly group to enable those who are less able to interact and find themselves isolated, to meet for a chat and refreshments and listen to a rural or locally inspired speaker.

Awards for All equipment grant - a grant received in a previous year for the purchase and set up of new computer equipment. This is has been capitalised and depreciated over 4 years. Each year an equivalent amount of grant is released to match the depreciation shown in the accounts. This is the final year and all assets are now fully depreciated.

One Stop - run in conjunction with Ryedale Charities Together the Community One Stop is a doorway into the voluntary sector providing information, advice and free activities.

NYCC FEF Fund - a grant received in 2020/21 of £2,000 for 'Food and Essentials Fund'; to ease cashflow and can be used to reimburse volunteers for any up-front costs incurred by them when purchasing food or essential items for people.

NHS App fund - a grant from NYCC Stronger Communities to promote the NHS App.
